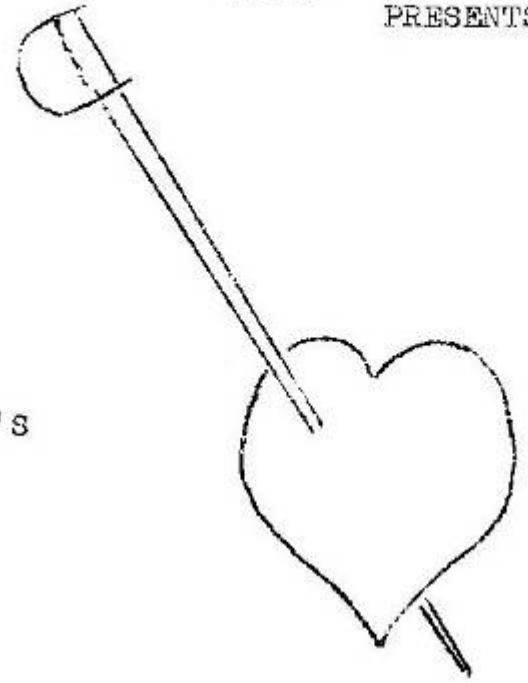

THE PLAY

Captain Bluntschli, a professional soldier, practical and straightforward, with no romantic illusions, brings Raina down to the level of his worldliness and raises her to his level of understanding.

Louka, a servant who aims at climbing the social ladder, by her cunning, knocks the romanticism out of Sergius.

Shaw could not help but see the funny side of these clashes of personality, while he seriously believed that the world must rid itself of the romantics --- that only logical, scientific thinking can produce a sane and peaceful world. Therefore in his play, the anti-romantics win the day.
