Robyn Byles: Formerly with the Bathurst Players, Robyn has brought her special poise and ability to a number of WDG productions. She played the mother in Ray Lawler's drama *Kid Stakes* and has romped through such farces as *Brush With a Body* and *Pajama Tops*.

Jim Dobbyn: Jim has appeared in musicals with The Entrance Theatre Co and Gosford Musical Society and in the thriller *Wait Until Dark* with Gosford Players. His last appearance at Wyong was in the comedy *Pajama Tops*. Jim's skills in set design and construction are an asset to any show in which he takes part.

Nigel Eynon: Considerable experience on stage as a magician and entertainer finally led Nigel to offer his services to WDG as make-up artist. After a year, and tiring of the back stage lipstick, blush and cheek and aided by the sudden inability of a body to appear, he took up the challenge and agreed to step into the breach.

Deidre Hodges: A relative newcomer to the stage, Deidre has appeared in the chorus of Youtheatre's *Oklahoma* and has been involved with WDG since last year, having assisted behind the scenes in *Pajama Tops*.

Ruth Jordon: A key member of WDG, Ruth combines flair as a performer with administrative acumen as our longtime Treasurer. Ruth has played the gamut, from blushing maidens in melodrama to intense roles in such serious pieces as *The One Day of the Year*, but her current incarnation as the slatternly tea-lady is something new.

Ray Noonan: Ray has directed and performed in a number of WDG productions as well as for other groups on the Central Coast. He was last seen as Mr Needham in *No Sex Please, We're British*, earlier this year and directed *Pajama Tops* in November 1990.

Howard Oxley: In his six years with WDG, Howard has developed a comedy style all his own. He was last seen as the lead in the farce *Pajama Tops* in November, and he co-directed another farce, *Brush with a Body*, the year before. As our popular President, Howard has presided over a period of growth and success for the Group.

Shawn Rix: Shawn has been interested in drama since 1988 and has appeared in five plays including *Kid Stakes*, *Home Fires Burning*, *No Sex Please, We're British*. He considers his present role as Doug to be his most enjoyable to date.

László Weidlich: The kind of actor any theatre group likes to have, László does excellent work in comedy and can also turn in a powerful dramatic performance, as in the role of Alf in *The One Day of the Year*, or, more recently, in Albee's *The Zoo Story*.
